

147th Grand Lodge Session

Richmond – After Committee on Work member WPM Jermaine Jones #67 gave orders to W. Grand Tiler James Tabron, Jr. #93 to secure the session's entrance before starting the session, over 500 delegates were seated. RW Grand Lectures Jose R. Ortiz #34 and Larry T. Johnson #298 found the opportunity to give everyone instructions on receiving Most Worshipful Grand Master Donald S. Wilson #67 and the other Grand Lodge Officers.









The W. District Deputy Grand Masters were first received with WDDGM Lynwood Jones #27 introducing them. Following them were the Grand Lodge Appointed Officers who were introduced by WGSS Robert Garris #80, the RW Grand Directors who were introduced by RWGD Charles A. Jones, Sr. #81, the MWPGM's who were introduced by MWPGM Billie Thompson #, the RW Grand Line Elected Officers who were introduced by George T. Cutler, Jr. #80 and RW Deputy Grand Master Beverly —Butch" Morgan #298.







Under the escort of the King Baldwin Commandery Knights Templar of Virginia (PHA), MWGM Wilson was properly received into the 147th Most Worshipful Prince Hall Grand Lodge of Virginia Free and Accepted Masons, Inc. The Grand Master then had the Proclamation for the session read by RW Sr. Grand Deacon Antonio R. Pride #43. While waiting for the Credential Report, the Grand Master spoke on COVID updates and mask wearing. The Partial Credential Report of lodges #146, #1, #89, #20 and #33 was read by WPM Gregory Goode #43.











The Grand Master then recognized 41 first-time attendees who stood and Brother Jerrod Davenport #161spoke on their behalf. Welcoming them were RW Jr. Grand Deacon Alton L. Miles #196 and RW Jr. Grand Warden Edward E. Lattimore, III #13.













RWDGM Morgan then stepped to the podium to introduce Grand Master Wilson who would give his Annual Address to the body. Giving praise to God first, the Grand Master asked Grand Chaplain Evans to pray for a blessed session at the altar. Grand Master Wilson focused on issues on the passing of 255 Brothers, the War in Ukraine, mass shootings in the US, importance of voting, praised the successful SOI's, recognized the Golf Tournament, highlighted the Mid-Atlantic & Grand Masters Conferences, giving out over \$43,000 in scholarships, the KOP, PH Family Day, the Car Raffle, the Bee Hive, the Kilmarnock Project, Fraternal Relations, the OES, the Charity Ball, the Veteran Programs, his Official Acts and his Recommendations.

The Grand Master also recognized disasters in America and asked for a special collection for the Maui, Hawaii and New Jersey Grand Lodges. Over \$1,775.00 was collected which was rounded off to \$2,000.00 and will be equally divided and sent to those Grand Lodges.

Next on the agenda were Grand Lodge reports. RW Grand Secretary Stevie R. Gray #314 gave the Grand Secretary's report and RW Grand Treasurer Rendell R. Briggs #43 followed with the Grand Treasury's report. These were followed by the Grand Director's report read by RWGD Charles A. Jones, Sr. #81, the Budget report read by WAGT Richard C. Dotson #107, the Grand Lecturers reports of RWGL Jose R. Ortiz #34 & Larry T. Johnson #298 and the Kilmarnock Project report presented by RWGD Earnest L. Prather #293.

MWGM Wilson then proceeded to pass the gavel to Sr. Past Grand Master Billie Thompson #46 who conducted nominations for elections. While the Grand Master nominated RWDGM Morgan as Grand Master, RWDGM Morgan nominated RWSGW Cutler as DGM. MWPGM Lionel Spruill #189 moved that all other line officers including the GT and the GS move up which was properly seconded and motion for adoption prevailed.

Nominations for RWJGD included Carl Albritten #298, Hozsa Bagley #17, Curtis James #67, Lynwood Jones #27, Terry Parker #327 and Roger Redd #109. While no one contested the Grand Lecturer of the West, nominations for Grand Lecturer of the East included Jose R. Ortiz #34 and Morris Hicks #6. After nominations for the two Grand Director positions only included Charles A. Jones, Sr. #81 and Larry D. Christian #253, no election was necessary.

Following the Credential Committee final report of 125 lodges (times 3), 10 Grand Lodge line officers, 11 Grand Directors, 9 MWPGM's, 1 DDGM and 1 WPM votes, total votes was 407. While the Grand Lecturer vote was Jose R. Ortiz received 330 and Morris Hicks # 70, a run-off for RWJGD revealed Curtis James with 203 verses Hozsa Bagley with 191 votes.

After the results of the election were given, Grand Master Wilson continued receiving reports. The reports continued with the Constitution report read by MWPGM Herman Eggleston #146, Jurisprudence report read by MWPGM Billie Thompson #46, the Committee on Foreign Correspondence read by MWPGM Paige Cherry #3, the Historian report read by MacArthur Myers #1, the Publishing Board report read by L. J. McCoy #33, the Charity report read by Michael Wilson #2, Committee on Work read by Lawrence Harper #293, Grand Master's Address report read by Curtis Gunn #3, the Kidney Walk report read by Melvin Simmons #139, the Registration report read by John Roster #280, the KOP report read by Carl Albritton #298 and the Education report read by Willie Wright #2.





















MWGM Wilson then took the opportunity to receive our visiting Sister Jurisdictions. Representing Maryland's MWGM Noel C. Osborne, Sr. was Dwayne E. Wright; MWGM Donald E. Strehle of the Grand Lodge of Virginia AF &AM; MWGM Kevin Almore of West Virginia; and Arthur Corlitt of the District of Columbia.









Also in attendance were Virginia State Council of the Assemblies Order of the Golden Circle, King Cyrus Grand Chapter Holy Royal Arch Masons, Gilgal Grand Court Heroines of Jericho, King Baldwin Grand Commandrey Knights Templar and the Most Royal Grand Court of Cyrene.









The Grand Master also received State Director of the KOP Carl Albritten #298 and Grand Worthy Matron Jacqueline T. Sutton, Grand Worthy Patron Albert Ruffin and 155 Sisters of the Order of the Eastern Star.







As the closing ceremonies began with the installation of new line officers, MWPGM Billie L. Thompson #46 conducted the procedures. Prayer by the W. Grand Chaplain blessed the proceeding as MWPGM Wilson was installed which was followed by the incoming Most Worshipful Grand Master Beverly W. Morgan #298. 

Hopewell – Fighting for civil rights in the Hopewell and surrounding areas, laying down in the streets of Suffolk to stop trucks with environmental waste and marching with the Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. throughout the south, the late WPM Curtis W. Harris, Sr. #33 was a legend in his own time. Brother Harris was honored by the City of Hopewell on December 2, 2023 with the unveiling of his statue in the city's plaza.

Dr. Harris began his civil rights work as early as 1950, when he was elected president of the Hopewell NAACP. Ten years later, he was arrested and sentenced to 60 days in jail for his role in a sit-in of a segregated drugstore in the city. He then became a member of the National Southern Christian Leadership Conference. Joining forces with Rev. King, Harris accepted non-violent as the most practical method for civil rights even arrested 13 more times for civil disobedience.

Brother Harris was eventually, elected to the Hopewell City Council in 1986 and became the city's first African American Mayor on July 7, 1998. Serving 26 years in the city's politics, he retired on March 1, 2012.

The keynote speaker for the event was US Congresswoman Jennifer McClellan who reflected on his struggles in how African American woman were dismissed by our founding fathers.


